### **ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION**



The "We are Our Mountains" Territorial Development Agency was founded at the end of 2022 by Ruben Vardanyan and partners with the aim of implementing development and support projects (programs) for Artsakh and Syunik. During 2022-2023, the organization implemented projects (programs) worth more than \$2 million (the report is available via this link).

Despite the fact that Ruben Vardanyan, the founder of the organization, was illegally arrested on September 27, 2023 and is still in captivity in Azerbaijan, adhering to his humanitarian principles, he insisted on continuing the organization's charitable activities to support the people of Artsakh. Since October 2023, "We are Our Mountains" has continously helped families forcibly displaced from Artsakh recover from severe shocks, as well as adapt to new realities with dignity, promoting their social development and ensuring economic stability. In addition, the organization strives to enable people to realize their potential in Armenia.

In March 2024, the organization changed its name to the "We are Our Mountains" Development Agency.

In 2024, the "We Are Our Mountains" Development Agency implemented projects and programs worth **about \$350,000** which affected the lives of **about 9,000 people** in different regions of Armenia.

Below are presented projects implemented by the Development Agency "We are our mountains" during the reporting period, with detailed information on the funds spent, the geography of implementation and the number of beneficiaries.

# SUPPORT PROJECTS FOR INDIVIDUALS FORCIBLY DISPLACED FROM ARTSAKH

## SUPPORT FOR ARTSAKH CRAFTSMEN

Many of our compatriots forcibly displaced from Artsakh were engaged in handicraft work in their native region, maintaining family traditions and passing on their skills from generation to generation. The "Assistance to Artsakh Craftsmen" project is aimed at helping these craftsmen to restore their activities in Armenia as soon as possible and improve the economic situation of their families. Within the framework of the project, vocational training and retraining courses were organized for the craftsmen, and the necessary tools for work were provided for up to \$1,300.

During the reporting period, **89 craftsmen** received support, including tailors, jewelers, shoemakers, welders, potters, carpenters, blacksmiths, masons, confectioners, furniture makers, repairmen, hairdressers, carpet weavers and other specialists. Of these, **28 people** completed professional training courses.

The project became an excellent opportunity for the craftsmen not only to resume their activities, but also to establish connections with each other, which contributed to their unification and mutual support.

### Vrezh's New Forge



Upon reaching retirement age, Vrezh, a former military officer, gathered his craftsmen and opened a workshop in Stepanakert, focusing mainly on welding work.

Due to the forced displacement, Vrezh left behind not only his home and everything that had been painstakingly created over many years, but also the tools and equipment that were the main means of livelihood for his family.



After finding shelter in Armenia and confronting new challenges, Vrezh resolved to find the strength within himself and start his work anew. Having gathered his team members from different cities of Armenia, he literally began to bend iron by hand due to the lack of proper equipment and tools.

Vrezh and his colleagues also became beneficiaries of the "Assistance to Artsakh Craftsmen" project and received the necessary tools. **"Each tool is one workplace,"** says Vrezh. Having achieved initial success in the new forge, Vrezh and his team expanded their activities and are already taking on larger orders.

### Furniture maker Narek and his "Artsakh team"



Experienced furniture maker Narek and his team had been successfully operating in Artsakh before the forced mass displacement from the region. Upon reaching Armenia, they, like many other displaced persons, faced a new challenge – starting from scratch. The team had to adapt to the new environment and rebuild their business given their limited resources.

"We had a large production facility in Artsakh," recalls Narek. "Having made it to Armenia with difficulty, we thought about reviving production on this land. But we had practically nothing – all the equipment, machinery, and tools remained in Artsakh. We decided to take the risk and start with small steps."

Two months later, Narek learned about the "Help for Artsakh Craftsmen" project organized by the Agency. After submitting an application, they received the necessary assistance in the shortest possible time, which allowed them to purchase tools and equipment to resume production. Although much still needs to be purchased, Narek's team has already achieved good results.


"We purchased 40% of the necessary equipment, and this was a significant step forward for us," he shares. This support has also allowed Narek to bring back many of his artisans, offering them work and stability in a new environment. The team has already established itself through high-quality products and prompt service.

"The Artsakh Team is our brand," Narek says proudly. "We are known as a team from Artsakh that produces high-quality furniture."

### Lilit's New Profession

"After we were evicted from Artsakh, we all had mixed feelings. We didn't know what would happen next, how our lives would turn out... At first, we were hesitant about whether we could start something from scratch. But in the end, we decided that starting any business is a risk. We took the risk, and everything worked out," says hairdressing master and treatment specialist Lilit.

Her first profession was economics. In Artsakh, Lilit worked at the Artsakhenergo company. After the forced displacement, she thought about finding a job that would allow her to be close to children. She tried to get a job as a dance teacher in a kindergarten, but after not receiving a positive response, she decided to master the hairdressing business.



"I didn't have any tools, it was very difficult to start from scratch. But during my studies, I learned about the project of the organization "We are our mountains" to support masters, including providing tools. Honestly, I didn't believe it, but I still signed up. And then one day they called me and said: "Come and choose the instruments." I still doubted, but when I saw that it was real, it became a huge support for me. I received the instruments on December 30 and already started working on January 10," Lilit admits.

Lilit is not just a hairdresser; she is a new generation specialist who has mastered the skills of hair treatment and reconstruction. This profession, known as a treatment specialist, is increasingly in demand and is becoming more and more popular. Thanks to the project, Lilit got the opportunity to improve her skills and continue working in a new field, which opened up new horizons in her profession. Lilit has been working in her new specialty for a year now, and she has a dream - to open her own school. "I want to teach others this business. This is a popular specialty, you can work anywhere," she says, adding: "I hope we will return to Artsakh. I don't know when, but we must stay here in order to return later, to return Artsakh."

The project "SUPPORT FOR ARTSAKH CRAFTSMEN", initiated by the "We Are Our Mountains" organization, is aimed at helping craftsmen from Artsakh realize their potential in Armenia and not leave in search of work abroad.

In 2024, the project expenditure exceeded **\$90,000.** The project was made possible through the generous support from the **Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation, Saint Sarkis Charity Trust, Stepan Gevorgyan and Noah's Children Charity Foundation,** and donations from friends and supporters of the organization. Given the tangible impact and effectiveness of the project, as well as the high demand among IDPs from Artsakh, plans are in place to continue and expand the project in 2025.







# WINGS: Rehabilitation Program for Children and Their Parents Displaced from Artsakh

"The easiest way to gain wings is to give them to someone who needs them."

The success of the pilot phase of the "Wings" rehabilitation program, implemented in Dilijan in 2023, inspired the Agency to continue its implementation in 2024. The program focuses on the comprehensive rehabilitation of forcibly displaced children from Artsakh aged 4 to 18 years. Thanks to donor support, in 2024 the Agency not only sustained the program in Dilijan but also expanded its geography, allowing 48 children and their parents from Gyumri to participate in the program as well. In total, **222 children and their parents** living in Dilijan and Gyumri participated in the Wings program in 2024.




The program aims to restore the physical, psychological and mental well-being of children, as well as to improve the psychological state of their parents. In addition to the main components of the program (art therapy, sports, development of resilience and leadership skills), elements of social integration were added to it, such as activities involving the local population, orientation tours, and hikes, so that children could adapt to the new environment. Parents had the opportunity to take part in individual therapy sessions.

### The main partners of the program were:

- Dilijan Community Center
- Tourism and Urban Development Charity Fund (TUF)
- Educational platform "Climate Uturn"

Based on psychodiagnostics assessments and parental feedback, it became clear that the children were experiencing problems such as insomnia, anxiety, fear, uncertainty, mistrust, hopelessness, stress and emotional instability. The comprehensive measures and targeted efforts of the "Wings" program helped significantly alleviate these problems, and by the program's completion, most children demonstrated significant progress in psychological well-being, indicating increased resilience and hope for the future (see chart)\*.

An additional component of the "Wings" program was psychological healing for families through individual and group therapy. **70%** of parents who underwent therapy showed stabilized psychological conditions, while the rest expressed a desire to continue working with specialists.

Survey results also showed that the most popular and in-demand element of the program was the social integration component, which included excursions, activities with local residents, and hikes, allowing children to better adapt to their new place of residence.

The goal of the "Wings" program extends beyond its immediate impact on participants. The program aims to create a wave effect of healing and resilience, preventing the transmission of trauma to future generations.

The project was implemented thanks to significant support from the "Dar" Educational Charitable Foundation, the "Artsakh Support Association," and individual donations from friends and allies of the organization.

The total program expenses for the reporting period amounted to approximately **\$109,400.**

## "LEADERS-2-LEADERS" CONTINUOUS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

In 2022, Ruben Vardanyan, together with the "Matena" International School of Leadership and Professional Development, initiated and implemented the "Leadership and Motivation" program for heads of state institutions and the private sector of the Republic of Artsakh. The program continued even during the blockade of Artsakh by Azerbaijan, in an online format.

After the forced displacement of the people of Artsakh from their historical homeland, on the initiative of the "We Are Our Mountains" Agency, through joint efforts of experts and graduates of the "Matena" International School of Leadership and Professional Development, the International Coaching Federation of Armenia, and graduates of world-renowned educational institutions, the program was continued in Armenia and was named Leaders-2-Leaders.



### "Leaders-2-Leaders" is a continuous development program for future leaders among those forcibly displaced from Artsakh.

The program aims to support comprehensive professional development and retraining processes, increase participants' competitiveness in the labor market, assist in developing their entrepreneurial initiatives, and, most importantly, create a reliable network of like-minded leaders.

The first module of the program took place in November-December 2023 for participants. In 2024, the program continued – two new program modules were launched: "Building the Future and Goal Setting" and "Employment and Career Support." **25 participants** of the Leaders-2-Leaders program received certificates of program completion.

During the reporting period, approximately **70%** of program participants were able to find employment.

The program budget was **approximately \$22,900**, which was provided by trainers on a pro bono basis.



## "TREE OF LIFE": BENEVOLENT INITIATIVE CULTIVATING AN ORCHARD IN TATEV

It is necessary to revive the spiritual center of Syunik so that the entire region develops around it, as it did a thousand years ago.

Continuing Ruben Vardanyan's programs in Tatev and expressing the continuity of his charitable "We the mission. Are Our Mountains" Development Agency, together with partner organizations, implemented the "Tree of Life" initiative. Within the framework of this initiative, a new garden with 1,000 fruit trees was planted near Tatev Monastery and the "Wings of Tatev" cable car. This garden, located in the heart of Tatev, is unique in that about 300 individual benefactors from 23 countries and more than a dozen organizations took part in its creation, planting their trees and uniting around a charitable idea.









Today, when the founder of our organization Ruben Vardanyan is in prison in Baku, it is more than important to continue his work and implement his ideas. For Vardanyan, creating a garden has always been a symbol of creating goodness, a new beginning, which is why this project was initiated.





On May 25, a pilgrimage and joint prayer for the release of Ruben Vardanyan and other Armenian prisoners held in Baku prisons took place at the Cathedral of Saints Peter and Paul in Tatev. More than a 1000 people from different regions of Armenia and abroad took part in the pilgrimage. On the same day, a solemn opening ceremony of the garden took place, and the "Tree of Life" was planted next to the monastery - a plane tree symbolizing the longevity, resilience and creativity of the Armenian people.





Tatev is one of the symbols of the Armenian spiritual and national liberation revival.

Today, it is very important to draw inspiration and strength from our national and spiritual sources for our new awakening. In order to restore our wounded national dignity, break the destructive chain of despair and disappointment, it is also very important to quickly and safely return our prisoners held in Baku to their homeland.

As part of the Tree of Life pilgrimage, a number of ethnographic and cultural events were held in Tatev and Halidzor with the participation of Artsakh creative groups.

Thanks to the support of donors, "We are Our Mountains" also took care of the future of the garden: a drip irrigation system was created that will feed the garden, ensuring high yields in the future.

A part of the funds received as a result of the project was **directed to the needs of the Tatev Monastery**. "We are Our Mountains" also ensured the participation of **12 Tatev boys and girls in an international summer camp organized by UWC Dilijan**. In total, the actual budget of the project was about **\$ 100,700. 1,062 people** became beneficiaries of the project.

### FRENCH LANGUAGE PROGRAM FOR ARTSAKH STUDENTS

In March-June 2024, additional French lessons were organized at Yerevan Secondary School N48 named after Misak Manushyan for schoolchildren of grades 4-9 from Artsakh, who, after being forcibly displaced, settled in Yerevan and entered a school with in-depth study of French. The project was a pilot project, and its goal was to help children forcibly displaced from Artsakh make up for the lessons they missed due to the blockade and displacement, master new educational material and keep up with the school curriculum.

The classes were organized for **24 schoolchildren** from Artsakh studying in two age groups: grades 3-5 and 6-9. The lessons were conducted by the school's French teachers.

According to teachers and parents, the extracurricular French lessons were effective and greatly helped the children in their studies. An additional course organized for children from Artsakh also gave them a sense of familiarity, contributing to the emotional well-being of the children. The total cost of the project was about \$3,200.

French teacher, School N48, Yerevan

"When children from Artsakh came to our school in October 2023, most of them did not know French. Additional classes and summer school helped the children significantly reduce the knowledge gap and catch up with their classmates in French proficiency. I also see how happy the children of Artsakh are to see each other and study together."





The success of the project inspired the organizers to also initiate a summer practical course "Entertaining French", which, in addition to the students of the M. Manushyan School, included Artsakh students from other schools with French language instruction. In total, **36 Artsakh children became beneficiaries of the project.** 

The course was held in Yerevan park "Eraz". The program included exciting learning, including games in French, singing, oral role-playing games, writing exercises and much more. Children were also provided with food. Project costs were about \$6,300. The project was implemented thanks to the support of the Artsakh Support Association (France) and other donors.

## "TATEV CAVE GARDEN": NEW MARKET IN TATEV

In the fourth quarter of 2024, the Agency began work on the development of a new project to create a market for agricultural, souvenir and handicraft products in the Tatev community.

The Tatev Cave Garden project aims to create a unique market that will become an important part of the culture and economy of the Tatev community. The architectural concept of Tatev Cave Garden is inspired by the historical cave settlements of Syunik. This space will combine cultural heritage, innovative architecture and natural harmony. We strive to create a place that will serve not only as a shopping center, but also as a space for communication, inspiration and prosperity for both locals and tourists.

The project received its first donation of \$100,000 from Eric and Melina Israelian. The project is planned for completion in 2025.



## GIVE A HOLIDAY: NEW YEAR IN GYUMRI

On the eve of the New Year and Christmas, the "We Are Our Mountains" Development Agency implemented the "Give a Holiday" project aimed at supporting children forcibly displaced from Artsakh and currently living in Gyumri. The event was organized with the aim of creating a joyful atmosphere for children and promoting their psychological recovery and integration into the new environment.

The project was carried out from December 25, 2024 to January 6, 2025 with the support of partners, including the Tourism and Urban Development Charity Foundation (TUF) and the Toon Armeni in Gyumri. More than 140 children from families forced to leave their homes in Artsakh took part in the event.

The project participants were given the opportunity to use the city's New Year's infrastructure, including a skating rink, sleds, and Father Frost's house. This became not only an entertainment event for them, but also an important part of social interaction. Project costs were about **\$2,431**.







### DIRECT SOCIAL SUPPORT AND OTHER INITIATIVES

- In special social cases, the Agency provided direct financial support to people in difficult life situations: a disabled person in need of prosthetics, large families in Syunik and Aragatsotn, as well as people from other social groups. The funds allocated for the above-mentioned projects amounted to about **\$7,600**.
- The Agency actively participated in a number of public initiatives aimed at protecting the rights of Ruben Vardanyan and other Armenian prisoners illegally held in a Baku prison.
- Within the framework of the cooperation between "We Are Our Mountains" and the "Artsakh Support Association" (France), at the invitation of the latter, Agency representatives Narine Aghabalyan and Sona Hovhannisyan took part in a seminar on "Unification for Armenia and in Support of Forcibly Displaced Persons from Nagorno-Karabakh", held on May 14 in the Senate of the French Republic. Representatives of French structures providing support to forcibly displaced persons from Artsakh, as well as high-ranking diplomatic officials, took part in the discussion of issues of coordination of support provided to the residents of Artsakh who have taken refuge in Armenia.





During the reporting period, the Agency focused on enhancing the sustainability, accountability and innovation potential of the organization, using a grant received from the Near East Foundation under the STRIVE program. In particular, presentation multimedia materials on the activities of the organization were prepared, and an event called "New Year of Unity" was held, where projects and programs implemented by the Agency were presented.







Summing up the results of 2024, we can state that it was a period of overcoming challenges for us, but also a year of growth, new ideas and successful projects.

### RESULTS OF THE YEAR AND PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

Thus, in 2024, the "We Are Our Mountains" Development Agency, together with its partners, implemented projects and programs worth approximately **\$350,000** (see table), affecting the lives of approximately **9,000 people** in different regions of Armenia.

### **PLANS FOR 2025**

In **2025,** the We Are Our Mountains Agency intends to focus on long-term development programs, particularly in the areas of human capital development, preservation of Artsakh's cultural heritage and Tatev's territorial development, as well as increasing the sustainability of our projects through diversification of funding sources.

Attaching importance to the preservation of Artsakh's cultural heritage, with the support of the Calouste Gulbenkian Charitable Foundation, the organization has launched a new project to create an online platform for the preservation of Artsakh's intangible cultural heritage.

One of the key projects for **2025** will be the creation of a new market in Tatev, which is also aimed at realizing Ruben's vision for the revival of Tatev.

The annual pilgrimage to the Tatev Monastery at the end of May will not only become a spiritual event but will also serve the revival and economic stability of Tatev. This sacred journey will unite believers, cultural figures and entrepreneurs who strive to preserve and develop the region's unique traditions and customs.
